Dec 01, 2023 - The employer has updated their written first aid procedures.

Initiating order:

Jul 13, 2023 - The employer has not developed up-to-date written procedures for providing first aid at the worksite as the procedure are buried inside a site safety plan and the procedures provided to not contain the radio channel used with two way radios, the person to call for transportation is not named, how the attendant is to respond is missing and the name of the attendant is not listed as well as all supplies was not listed.

This is in contravention of the Occupational Health and Safety Regulation Section 3.17(1).

The employer must keep up-to-date written procedures for providing first aid at the worksite including (a) the equipment, supplies, facilities, first aid attendants and services available, (b) the location of, and how to call for, first aid, (c) how the first aid attendant is to respond to a call for first aid, (d) the authority of the first aid attendant over the treatment of injured workers and the responsibility of the employer to report injuries to the board, (e) who is to call for transportation for the injured worker, and the method of transportation and calling, and (f) prearranged routes in and out of the workplace and to medical treatment.

Measures to Ensure Compliance:

Pursuant to section 88 (1) of the Workers Compensation Act, the employer must prepare a Notice of Compliance report. In accordance with section 88 (2), this report must detail what has been done to comply with the order, and where compliance has not been achieved by the time the report has been submitted, include a plan of what will be done to comply and when compliance will be achieved. Please submit the report no later than **July 28, 2023**.

The employer must immediately create a stand alone written first aid procedure that includes all the required information.

Orders/Items - Full Details**Initiating order:**

Jul 13, 2023 - This employer has not provided for adequate equipment, supplies, facilities, first aid attendants and services to promptly render first aid to injured workers as the emergency transport vehicle was not properly installed to the carrier and the written first aid procedures were not complete as well as all employers not having the stated methods to communicate with first aid.

This is in contravention of the Occupational Health and Safety Regulation Section 3.16(1)(a).

The employer must provide for each workplace such equipment, supplies, facilities, first aid attendants and services as are adequate and appropriate for (a) promptly rendering first aid to workers if they suffer an injury at work, and (b) transporting injured workers to medical treatment.

Measures to Ensure Compliance:

Pursuant to section 88 (1) of the Workers Compensation Act, the employer must prepare a Notice of Compliance report. In accordance with section 88 (2), this report must detail what has been done to comply with the order, and where compliance has not been achieved by the time the report has been submitted, include a plan of what will be done to comply and when compliance will be achieved. Please submit the report no later than **July 28, 2023**.

The employer must take steps to ensure proper first aid supplies and equipment and procedures are provided for all workers.

Dec 01, 2023 - The employer took measures to ensure traffic control was improved and followed the manual.

Initiating order:

Jul 13, 2023 - The prime contractor did not ensure that traffic control equipment, arrangements or layouts and procedures, to the extent practicable, meet the requirements of the Traffic Management Manual and/or this Regulation as not enough TCP's were present, at the time of inspection, the employer did not use alternative means of traffic control when possible and did not follow it's own TMP.

This is in contravention of the Occupational Health and Safety Regulation Section 18.3.(2).

An employer must ensure that traffic control equipment, arrangements or layouts and procedures, to the extent practicable, meet the requirements of the Traffic Management Manual unless otherwise specified in this Regulation or in the Act.

Measures to Ensure Compliance:

Pursuant to section 88 (1) of the Workers Compensation Act, the employer must prepare a Notice of Compliance report. In accordance with section 88 (2), this report must detail what has been done to comply with the order, and where compliance has not been achieved by the time the report has been submitted, include a plan of what will be done to comply and when compliance will be achieved. The prime contractor and employer must develop measures to ensure traffic control is correct at it's workplaces.

Initiating order:

Jul 13, 2023 - The employer/prime contractor allowed work to start without ensuring a risk assessment was completed as one was not present at the time of inspection.

This is in contravention of the Occupational Health and Safety Regulation Section 18.3.1(1).

An employer must not permit workers to engage in a work activity that may expose workers to traffic unless a risk assessment has first been completed by a qualified person and the risk assessment (a) meets the requirements of subsections (2) or (3), as applicable, and (b) takes into account the risks to worker health and safety whenever traffic control is required for (i) emergent work, (ii) brief duration work, (iii) short duration work, or (iv) long duration work.

Measures to Ensure Compliance:

Pursuant to section 88 (1) of the Workers Compensation Act, the employer must prepare a Notice of Compliance report. In accordance with section 88 (2), this report must detail what has been done to comply with the order, and where compliance has not been achieved by the time the report has been submitted, include a plan of what will be done to comply and when compliance will be achieved. Please submit the report no later than **July 28, 2023**.

The prime contractor must take steps to ensure a risk assessment is conducted prior to the start of work each day or verify the previous risk assessment is valid for the current days work.

Progress towards compliance:

Dec 01, 2023 - The employer has taken steps to ensure plans are in place.

Initiating order:

Jul 13, 2023 - The employer/prime contractor who is responsible for short duration work and long duration work did not ensure that a written traffic control plan was developed based on the risk assessment as one was not present at the time of inspection.

This is in contravention of the Occupational Health and Safety Regulation Section 18.3.2(1).

An employer responsible for short duration work or long duration work must ensure that a written traffic control plan is developed based on the risk assessment.

Measures to Ensure Compliance:

Pursuant to section 88 (1) of the Workers Compensation Act, the employer must prepare a Notice of Compliance report. In accordance with section 88 (2), this report must detail what has been done to comply with the order, and where compliance has not been achieved by the time the report has been submitted, include a plan of what will be done to comply and when compliance will be achieved. Please submit the report no later than **July 28, 2023**.

The employer must take steps to ensure a traffic control plan is created prior to work starting work each day.

Order/Item No.6

Progress towards compliance:

Dec 01, 2023 - The project has ended.

Orders/Items - Full Details

Initiating order:

Jul 13, 2023 - The employer has not ensured the health and safety of all workers working for that employer, and any other workers present at a workplace at which that employer's work is being carried out as the MTC was not secured to the carrier vehicle properly, first aid procedures were not complete and separate, and traffic control was not being conducted properly placing all workers on or near the road at increased risk of injury or death.

This is in contravention of the Workers Compensation Act Section 21(1).

Every employer must ensure the health and safety of: (i) all workers working for that employer, and (ii) any other workers present at a workplace at which that employer's work is being carried out, and (b) comply with the OHS provisions, the regulations and any applicable orders.

Measures to Ensure Compliance:

Pursuant to section 88 (1) of the Workers Compensation Act, the employer must prepare a Notice of Compliance report. In accordance with section 88 (2), this report must detail what has been done to comply with the order, and where compliance has not been achieved by the time the report has been submitted, include a plan of what will be done to comply and when compliance will be achieved. Please submit the report no later than **July 28, 2023**.

The employer must take steps to ensure the health and safety of all workers present at its workplace.

Dec 01, 2023 - The employer has supplied measures to ensure compliance.

Initiating order:

Jul 13, 2023 - The prime contractor of this multiple-employer workplace has not been doing everything that is reasonably practicable to establish and maintain an effective system or process that will ensure compliance with the OHS provisions and the regulations in respect of the workplace as traffic control did not follow the regulation and the standard as can be seen in IR202317791049A, the mobile treatment center was not properly inspected and was not attached to the carrier vehicle properly as outlined in IR202317791050A, the asphalt cutting was not done in a manner to properly protect the worker operating the saw and there was not compliant procedures nor an exposure control plan as can be seen in IR202317791048A.

This is in contravention of the Workers Compensation Act Section 24 (1)(b).

The prime contractor of a multiple-employer workplace must do everything that is reasonably practicable to establish and maintain a system or process that will ensure compliance with the OHS provisions and the regulations in respect of the workplace.

Measures to Ensure Compliance:

Pursuant to section 88 (1) of the Workers Compensation Act, the employer must prepare a Notice of Compliance report. In accordance with section 88 (2), this report must detail what has been done to comply with the order, and where compliance has not been achieved by the time the report has been submitted, include a plan of what will be done to comply and when compliance will be achieved. Please submit the report no later than **July 28, 2023**.

The employer must improve it's process to ensure it has an effective system to ensure compliance at it's workplace.
