### **February 2026 POLICING REPORT**

The following information is provided as the February 2026 Fort St John Detachment update on crime statistics, police activity, and new developments within the detachment operations and administration.

### **DETACHMENT RESOURCE REPORTING**

For the month of February 2026, the detachment operated with 5 x soft (temporary) vacancies and 4 hard vacancies which include:

- 2 members off duty sick, 1 member on Parental leave, 2 members on administrative leave.
- 1 Serious Crime Constable position is vacant; 1 position is vacant in Municipal Traffic, and 2 are vacant in General Duty.
- an experienced member and a new member started this month.
- a new member has been identified to start April.

### **CRIME TREND REPORTING**

February 2026 resulted in a total of 838 calls for service, 685 were in the City of Fort St John, and 153 were in surrounding rural areas. This is down from 864 calls for service when compared to the same period in 2025, or a decrease of approximately 3%.

February saw a slight downward trend in property crime when compared to January. Theft of Motor Vehicles went from 5 to 4 incidents reported and theft from motor vehicle saw a decrease from 8 to 7 reports. Thefts in general went from 51 reported incidents in January, to 43 this month. Calls regarding mental health decreased from 18 calls to 14.

## HIGHLIGHTS

February was a challenging month for the members in Fort St. John and the surrounding areas. Following the tragic events in Tumbler Ridge, many members responded to the call for assistance, and the detachment has been working closely with all those affected to ensure they receive the support they need while processing such a horrific incident.

In the midst of this difficult time, the Fort St. John RCMP organized a fundraiser for the community of Tumbler Ridge. The event was a tremendous success, showcasing the generosity and compassion of local residents and businesses. Thanks to their support, a total of **\$49,790.00** was raised and donated to the **Tumbler Ridge Community Resiliency Fund** to help provide lasting support for the community.
